

Chairman's Message

Welcome to our newsletter and thanks to Mike Brown, our new editor, for making it possible. Mike volunteered to help us following an appeal for help. It's only thanks to volunteers like Mike that we can be an effective council, so I'm going to focus on volunteering in this message.

Upper Beeding Parish Council should have fifteen members. We only have seven. While we can keep our heads above water we are struggling. There are projects we would like to make progress on that are currently stalled because nobody can take them on: improvements to public rights of way, a new sports pavilion, new play equipment in the children's play areas, an outdoor gym, developing new public amenity spaces and more. Ultimately we all lose because the council cannot keep our facilities up to the kind of standards we need today.

We need you, the public, to come forward.

You may have read about the Small Dole skate park. It is now being repaired and improved with council funding. It was going to close, but members of public came forward, joined us in a special committee and found a way of saving the facility. This is a prime example of how volunteers helped us to make a difference.

Another project that needs volunteers is the proposal from the Breton village of Livré-sur-Changeon that we should twin with them. These schemes need public involvement to take them forward. If you were at the Annual Parish Meeting you will have seen their impressive presentation. Livré is an attractive looking place, slightly more rural than Beeding but with a lot in common. We would all benefit from developing a closer relationship with our neighbours across the channel, perhaps with sporting exchanges, school connections or cultural events. Again if you're interested in any way we would like to hear from you.

Volunteers are also needed to help the Youth Service. SAYS, the charity that set up the service, along with the four local parish councils, pays for some youth workers but volunteers are needed to enable the service to offer more activities.

Finally we are nearing the pre-submission stage of the Neighbourhood Plan. Again this is all down to volunteers and we will all benefit if it is successful.

If we all came forward just to offer a little help we could achieve so much! Please get in touch to find out more if you are in any way interested in volunteering to help the Youth Service, the twinning proposal, the Neighbourhood Plan or especially if you want to join the Parish Council!

A very good question; as we were hoping to update you by now with a summary of what to expect in the Draft Plan, where copies would be available for you to read and some dates for you to attend Open Sessions in Upper Beeding and Small Dole where you could discuss any queries, dislikes, missing entries etc. with the NP Team and formally raise any concerns, and provide evidence for any requests to changes or objections.

Unfortunately we have had some delays by our consultants rCOH in producing the Draft Plan and at the time of writing this we are in dispute with them as to what they had promised to produce and when and them asking for more money!!


We hope this will be resolved through AiRS who is our support in producing the whole plan, so watch your door mats in the next few weeks for an update, where and when you can view the Draft Plan and discuss.

We have produced a list of our Green Spaces in the Parish (Environment & Countryside Doc.), a list of our proposed Sites for future Small Developments, a Design Statement and our Policy on the Cement Works (Housing & Development Doc.), some recommendations on the Local Economy and recommendations for our Community and Infrastructure (in their respective Docs). There is a lot of information and recommendations to improve our Parish going forward over the next 15 years, why not take a look?

Village Hall News

At the hall's AGM the following officers were elected: Chairman Susan Albery; Vice-Chairman Maggie Hall; Treasurer Sue Plassing and Secretary Jean Armour-Milne. The treasurer indicated that this would probably be her last year, so, is there anyone from the local community who has any experience with finances that would consider putting themselves forward.

During the last year there have been quite a few improvements made to the interior of the hall. The main hall has had new flooring (thanks to the Parish Council for their help), new sidelights, together with the new upholstered chairs make it the perfect place to hold that celebration party. This coming year we are looking at the outside of the hall to improve storage facilities and tidy up the appearance of the garden space. Did you know there is a WW2 air raid shelter in its grounds? During the last two years it has been renovated so that it once again has a useful function.

As an entirely self-supporting entity we rely a lot on our various fund raising activities. Are you a member of the hall's 200 club? The cost is £12 a year or £1 a month, there are 12 draws a year and half the money goes as prizes. This activity is a registered lottery with Horsham District Council last year it raised over £650 for hall improvements. Application forms are available from user groups. The monthly quiz has a regular following, it is held on the third Wednesday of each month and is for teams of up to 6 players but if you are on your own then you can be fitted into another team. The cost is £1 per player, there is a raffle and tea/coffee are available but you can bring your own refreshment. There are other activities that you could support.

On Saturday 26 November there is the Christmas Fair with many stalls, just the perfect time for you to buy your presents. If you knit, sew, paint, make decorations or make jewellery then consider having a stall which cost £6 per table just contact our secretary on 01273 493184 to book your place.

Beeding and Bramber Local History Society

The Society does not hold any meetings during the summer months, but has just received copies of the latest edition of our book: "Beeding – History of a Village". We would like to thank the Parish Council and Zoe Bates of Valerie Manor for their grants towards the cost of publication

We have kept the price at £7.50, the same as the previous edition, even though it has two extra chapters. One is called "Manors and Manor Houses" about all the manors that previously made up our parish: mainly Sele, Beeding, Horton and Tottington. Another chapter gives the history of Small Dole and we have also added the strange tale of a Dreadful Fatality at the Rising Sun. The book is available from 12, Towers Road, Upper Beeding and from local bookshops.

We are now busy preparing another book for publication about The People of Beeding and Bramber in the Great War. It includes our research into all the men who are listed on our war memorials and many others who served and survived, with background information about life in the village at the time. Many local descendants have contributed information and photographs and West Sussex County Council gave us a generous grant to fund the project.

Hanging Baskets. This year, for a change, these will be planted with "Million Bells" in deep blue, deep pink and white. These plants can cope with being watered every third day. Our containers will be planted with impatiens of a similar colour. We use these because they quickly fill the containers, which minimises weeding, and bloom well through into September.

Our flowerbeds are mainly planted with shrubs, but additional colour is added by spring bulbs and summer annuals. 
