In my welcome address I appealed for people to come forward to join the Parish Council. We currently have 8 councillors when we should have 15. We simply cannot carry out the work that the parish needs with such small numbers. What is more we aren't diverse enough, a council should look like the people it works for. If you've ever thought you might be interested please get in touch or come along to a meeting. We hold two meetings a month, usually the first and third Tuesdays. Councillors can

make a real difference to the community in which they live.

Recent works of note that the Parish Council has done include the annual maintenance of the Memorial Playing Field, one of the best in Sussex according to feedback from our sports clubs.

The council also signed off the works to improve the Small Dole skate park, though there are plans to install a grind rail in the near future. You might have noticed that our larger grass areas are now being mowed more frequently and that street signs are being cleaned. These works came about through the initiatives by councillors, or in the case of the skate park where councillors responded to members of public and worked together to create a great public amenity.

#### **Neighbourhood Plan Update Summer 2017**

In summary we have had a number of issues over the last year which I have summarised below:

•	Asked HDC to Review Allison's / Our Work to date	Jan. 2016
٠	HDC held NP Workshop to update new requirements	Jan. 2017
•	Work on UBNP on hold waiting feedback from HDC	March 2017
٠	Feedback on some of Draft NP & SA given/meeting with HDC	April 2017
•	NP Team decide to recommend NP without new HNS / sites	April 2017
•	Info provided that NP may not be accepted without HNS / sites	April 2017

This resulted in us asking the PC to consider the following having had updates from HDC NP, Chris Lyons Head of Planning, our Consultants, David Caldwell and the NP Team:

- 1. See if HDC would support the existing Housing Needs Survey with additional housing numbers added.
- 2. AiRS to identify the additional requirements of the AECOM HNS to their original one.
- 3. If 1 was not supported with the additional requirements of 2 to carry out the AECOM HNS.
- 4. Seek additional support from AiRS and a further grant and support from Locality.

Since sharing and discussing the above we have had further clarification from HDC and sight of the independent report Henfield had carried out on their failed NP. It is clear from both that **we will have to carry out a new HNS as per point**3. This would mean a new NP Plan being produced within the following time line:

- Pre submission draft for NP Team and PC to review (end of September '17)
- Reg14(Draft Plan) end Oct '17 for a minimum of 6 weeks (ending before Xmas)
- Analysing representations and amending submission plan January 2018
- Submission of Final NP Plan to HDC March 2018
- Submission to Independent Examiner April 2018
- Possible Referendum July 2018

I realise there is a lot to digest from the above but basically we must carry out another HNS in more detail to meet the tougher requirements being put in place by Councils and the Inspector. If we do not proceed in this way we could be open to having HDC impose sites on us for development or more Developers seeking places to build. ## **Village Hall News**

After a good ten years the pathway leading up to the hall has been completed and the outside has definitely been improved. Like all who are 80 years and over there is always something that needs to be done. The Hall has an enthusiastic group of helpers but, at times, there is a need for more. We have a good relationship with both Parish Councils but they do not own or run the hall so help from you the general public is really welcomed whether it be for tending to the three wall baskets and the two small flower beds at the front, small maintenance jobs or just moving tables and chairs for events.

The **AGM** was held at the beginning of May and the following officers elected: Chair Sue Albery; Vice-Chair Maggie Hall; Treasurer Sue Plassing and Secretary Jean Armour-Milne. The Committee consists of people from each regular user and five villagers. Works completed during the last twelve months have been the replacement of two sheds, the installation of a bin/cycle shelter which together with a new gate have helped to transform the outside area. All the work has been paid for out of hall funds. Fund raising is a vital part of the work carried out by the committee as this helps to improve on an already good environment.

The family fun day at the end of April was a success raising £650 and our thanks to all who attended and especially to those whose hard work helped to make the day run smoothly. The next event will be on Saturday 17 June when a local five –piece band **Desperate Measures** will be performing. They are a Rock, Rhythm & Blues band. Tickets are £5 in advance and £6 on the door. Tickets are available from Beeding News and Sue Plassing. See the posters for more details.

Regular events include the **quiz** on the third Wednesday of each month, the next ones being 21 June, 19 July and 16 August. Teams of up to 6 people but if you cannot raise six then just come along and we will fit you in. Cost is £1 a person and the cost of your raffle tickets. Refreshments are available but you can bring your own food and drink. The quiz setters change each month so you will certainly get a real variety each time.

The **200 Club** has been running for some time, you can join at any time of the year for £12, this entitles you to be entered for the next 12 monthly draws. The three prizes are, at the moment £30, £20 and £12. Prizemoney is determined by the number of entries as 50% goes back in prizes. This scheme is licensed with Horsham District Council so all residents are able to join the 200 club. How do I become a member? 




# A 2017 Christmas Stamp?
