

## Chairman's Message

Welcome to our Spring newsletter. I'm writing this in February just as the weather has finally changed and Spring seems to be finally starting. It's a huge relief when the cold and wet stops and the early flowers emerge. I've been delighted to see snowdrops, hellebores and daffodils flowering in my garden and frogs appearing in my pond.

Council business continues at its own pace through the year. You might remember we asked your opinion on a blanket 20mph speed limit for Beeding village some time ago. The paperwork finally reached the top of the relevant in-tray at West Sussex County Council so we hope to see some plans soon. If they are ready in time they will be displayed at the Annual Parish Meeting in April. Our County Councillor, David Barling, writes more on this elsewhere in this newsletter.

I mentioned the Annual Parish Meeting. It will be in Thursday 27th April in Beeding & Bramber Village Hall, 7pm arrival for a 7.30 start. Refreshments will be available.

The Parish Council is arranging speakers for the meeting and your councillors and wardens will be there to answer questions. There will be reports on the Neighbourhood Plan and the Twinning Scheme and a speaker from Neighbourhood Watch, plus more to be announced.

If there is anything you would like to discuss please let us know and we'll put it on the agenda. If there's someone you think we should invite to speak then similarly let us know: while the Parish Council organises the meeting it belongs to you, the public.

Last year the Small Dole skate park was in the news when plans to close it were published. There was an outcry from many skaters and concerned parishioners. As a result of work by councillors and members of public the ramps were redesigned and repaired.

I'm pleased to report that there will be an official opening of the skate park at Easter, though full arrangements have not yet been made. Keep an eye on our notice boards and local social media for further details.

The other big thing happening in local government this spring is the election of County Councillors. For some people May 4th is Star Wars Day. For the County Council it's Election Day! You can decide which is most exciting but if you want to enjoy both you need to register to vote immediately. The Parish Council meets on the first Tuesday of every month at and we hold committees on the third Tuesday. Generally we meet in Beeding & Bramber Village Hall though twice a year we meet in Small Dole Village Hall. The meetings are open to the public who are welcome to ask questions and observe. Our full meeting schedule is on our website and meetings are advertised on our notice boards.

## Village Hall News

The **AGM** of the Hall is on Monday **8 May** at 7.30pm.

This is when the managing trustees report to the residents of Upper Beeding and Bramber on what has been happening at the hall during the previous twelve months and their plans for the future. Comments are regularly made that the hall is financed by the Parish Councils, this is not true. The hall is a separate entity and the day to day running is financed by the hire of the facilities all improvements are normally financed from the fund raising that the trustees organise. The Parish Councils of Upper Beeding and Bramber can make grants to help with certain projects.

By the time this article is read the outside pathways should have been resurfaced and this means the refurbishment of the garden area will be complete. The two parish Councils have made grants towards this project. Attention then turns to the inside of the building. On the list for attention but in no particular order are: new chairs for the large room; a sound system for the main hall which will include an induction loop for the hard of hearing and a PA system; CCTV; repainting and possibly replacing the water heaters in both kitchens.

Fund raising events planned for 2017 include the **200 club** which is £12 for a year, this allows you to enter 12 monthly draws with half the money being allocated to prizes. Application forms are available from the hall.

- Saturday 29 April is a **Spring Fair** for all the family , food, entertainment, fancy dress etc. etc. See the posters for more details.

# Neighbourhood Wardens Helping to Reduce Social Isolation

Local neighbourhood wardens for the Steyning, Upper Beeding and Bramber areas have been engaging with older residents in the communities, as well as working with organisations and voluntary groups, to help reduce social isolation.

Wardens Paul Conroy and Michael Pearce run a weekly club at Dingemans Court and arrange quizzes, indoor sports sessions, afternoon teas and trips to garden centres and theatres.

Paul and Michael also attend the monthly Vintage Years Club meetings at Steyning Community Centre, giving out safety messages to older people, helping with transport and getting to know the local residents.

Paul said: "This is definitely one of the most rewarding parts of our role as neighbourhood wardens. Working with older people in the community gives us the opportunity to make a difference in their lives by interacting with them on a social level. Our club has been running for over two years now and we have got to know the members very well and consider them as our friends."

Michael added: "We are also hoping to build upon our existing relationship with the Upper Beeding lunch club and will be seeking ways to socially include a greater number of residents from across the three parishes in the coming year."

Paul and Michael have started running monthly 'surgeries' so local people can meet with them to discuss any issues or concerns. The next one in Steyning is on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> March in the Steyning Centre from 11am – 12 noon. There will also be a surgery at Upper Beeding Hub on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> March from 11am – 12 noon.

The Neighbourhood Warden Scheme aims to provide a reassuring presence in the community. Wardens can deal with issues such as anti-social behaviour and dog fouling; they offer advice on crime prevention; liaise with vulnerable residents and refer crime incidents to the Police, acting as professional witnesses. They are not, however, a replacement for the Police, nor are they an emergency service.

# 20mph for Upper Beeding?

I have been working closely with the Parish Council, in the interests of road safety and at long last, West Sussex County Council will carry out a formal consultation with the residents of Upper Beeding to see if they would like the speed limit throughout the whole of the village reduced to 20mph.

There are only three entrances to the Village so this would have to be done as one complete zone rather than piecemeal roads.

Very little if any, engineering works will need to be done so we are mainly talking about signage on the three entrances to the Village and roundels on roads. I believe the police will have no objection to the proposal.

The formal consultation will start shortly and be advertised on street sign notices, in the local press and on the Parish Council website. It is essential that as many residents as possible indicate whether they do or do not support such a proposal.

If there are no objections the Traffic Regulation Order reducing the speed limited to 20mph will be made by West Sussex County Council quickly. If there are more than five objections then the matter will be subject to an appraisal by highway officers who will send a report to the County Local Committee (the four local county councillors for Henfield, Storrington, Pulborough and our area) and I will be very much be guided by the Residents' opinions one way or the other, in informing and making my own decision.

We look forward to hearing your views.
