Neighbourhood Plan Update Winter 2018

The NP is progressing well. We have had meetings with the NP Team, HDC, our Consultants and Henfield PC NP Team. This resulted in a number of queries with the AECOM Site Assessment being clarified through a follow up meeting with AECOM.

We agreed with Henfield PC NP Team that both PCs will work together on ensuring sites being proposed in Small Dole are in the best interest of the whole Community of Small Dole and maintain the level of sustainability for a small village.

In addition to the AECOM meeting we have raised some questions with SDNPA regarding impact on views from the Downs on some developments, with the EA regarding flooding and their response to Riverside Caravan Park and informed landowners currently offering employment within the Parish to consider finding sites within the Parish for this employment to move to if their sites are used for development.

HDC submitted some corrections to the Site Assessment Document which AECOM have now amended following a review by Locality. The Document has now been accepted by the NP Team and will shortly be published on the NP PC website.

Whilst the Site Assessments were being finalised there was a suggestion made to consider whether the Old School House could be used for Housing Development. The old building is permanently used for year 5 and 6 classes

- A large area is used for computers.
- There are 2 more permanent buildings on what was the playground by the hall due to increase in admissions
- If the building is to be used further or the site better utilised it would be to increase the size of the school for future admissions if we provide new homes.
- Covenant in the deeds states the school must be retained for educational purposes SITES RECOMMENDED BY THE PC TO GO FORWARD IN THE NP ARE:

All Landowners or their Representatives have been updated on the recommendations and advised that further meetings will be set up with them.

We are now trying to finalise the Draft Neighbourhood Plan by early March when HDC will carry out a health check on the document which could take up to a further 6 weeks. Once this has been completed the document will be available for all the Community to Review (this will be a 6 week consultation period and meetings will be set up with the Community in Upper Beeding and Small Dole to discuss and input to the Document). A summary of the document, dates of meetings and where the document can be found will be sent to all households, hard copies will be available in public buildings around the Parish and available on the PC website.

LET US NOT FORGET

374414 Gunner Frederick John Holden

122nd Siege Battery, Royal Garrison Artillery

Frederick John Holden was born in Brighton in 1883, the son of John and Ellen Holden. The 1901 Census shows him aged 17, living with his parents and working as a postman. He married Grace Violet Coe, daughter of Annie Pointing by her previous marriage, in Brighton, in 1907. The 1911 Census for Brighton shows Frederick still working as a postman and living at 37 Shanklin Road, with Grace, and a 3-year-old son, William John.

Frederick enlisted, or was conscripted, in Brighton and was killed in action, aged 35, on March 23 1918. Having no known grave, he is commemorated on panel 10 of the Pozières Memorial (to the missing), Somme, France, and is also remembered on the Small Dole and Upper Beeding War Memorials.

Frederick was awarded the British War Medal and Victory Medal, which would tie in with his having been conscripted as a married man in 1916 or 1917. His brother-in-law, Leslie Pointing was killed in action just six months later; a double tragedy for the family.
