CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

Welcome to the spring newsletter. It's cold and wet outside as I write, but a few warm and sunny days have hinted at the approaching spring. If you're watching the daffs and crocuses and thinking of matters horticultural now is the time to start planning. Have you ever fancied home-grown veg? Do you want to produce dahlias or gladioli for showing? There are allotments free and it's the perfect time to take one on. While looking forward to spring it is still early enough in the year for bad weather. The Parish Council has arranged for grit bins in strategic points around our main settlements. The salt they contain is for public use. We also have two grit spreaders available for volunteers who want to cover their neighbourhoods more efficiently. These are simple push-along devices that can cover a wide area quickly. Please get in touch if there's a weather warning and you need to use one. We can arrange for you to collect one and sign it out for your use.

Still with winter in mind, we are concerned about vulnerable people. One of the great things about our villages is the way neighbours look out for each other. However we must remain concerned in case people are forgotten or left for some reason. If you or someone you know would welcome a friendly check every now and then we can add you to the list for our wardens to check on. If there is bad weather they will pay a special visit just to ensure that all is well. After the rains this time last year we have been looking at our flood defences. We have had meetings with Environment Agency officers with particular emphasis on the river embankments above Beeding Bridge. They assure us that the defences are up to standard, with only a 1% risk of failure in any year. We have accepted their assurances, though with weather reports seeming to increasingly tell us about highly unusual weather we remain concerned! The Environment Agency are currently facing another reorganisation following funding cuts and we have decided to wait until their plans have been announced before we take things further with them. We have previously asked whether anyone would be interested in forming a Flood Action Group in the parish. We had two respondents but need more. If you would like to help please contact the Clerk. Finally, we have our begging bowl out. We have been planning a new Sports Pavilion to replace the old changing rooms and containers on the Memorial Playing Field. The overall cost is £240k. We have all but £60k so we are seeking grants and donations towards this final sum. We are working on improving this rather run-down area but finding such funds is not easy in the current climate. We are very aware that the area has needed attention for some time, so thanks to all of you for your patience.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANNING UPDATE

Did you fill in your Housing Needs Survey (HNS) or if a business returned the Business Needs Survey (BNS). So far we have ascertained that there is a need for Affordable Housing (65% of you said so) but 61% of you do not want any more marketable housing and 63% said that the Parish has the right type of housing to meet their future needs. These numbers are based on a 24% response rate to the HNS.



Our job now is to use the data gathered in the HNS, that gathered in our Parish Survey in 2014, data from the 2011 and 2001 Census and the actions identified in the Parish Plan of 2007 to calculate what our requirements are and the evidence this is based on.

It's very clear that the villages do not want or need any major developments (such as Rydon Homes). What we do need is approximately 30 Affordable Homes, 30 Open Market Homes and some Sheltered Housing for our ageing population over the next 20 years. To be provided in small developments of 8, 12 or 20 houses as well as allowing the current one or two builds replacing existing on suitable plots. The Survey indicates that based on incomes we need to consider 'social housing' as there are very few houses with middle incomes which could afford "affordable rent" or some intermediate market housing product like shared ownership. A Community Land Trust (CLT) model may be worth exploring as this could seek to provide more genuinely affordable housing. It is also clear that some of the housing identified, needs to be rented rather than owned. More information on this will be published soon and we will be holding events in both Upper Beeding and Small Dole (**late March/early April depending on responses from landowners**) to share this with you along with sites that have been identified as suitable for development or to be designated green / amenity space to be kept for the Parish to use and enjoy. Our latest target is to complete our Draft Plan is optimistically the end of April. More info / detail on

BEEDING & SHOREHAM CEMENT WORKS

Another proposal that we as a community have produced to try and get something moving on the old Cement Works Site that has been redundant for the past 20+ years can be seen on our website

As you know we carried out a questionnaire back in 2014 asking people for their key issues and 74% said they would like to see something done to the Cement Works Site rather than it being left as an eyesore and blot on the countryside in SDNP.

Having visited the site owner Hargreaves, Dudmans (who have an option to buy) and the SDNP (the Planning Authority) it seemed pretty clear that nothing was going to happen for another 20 years unless we tried to do something about it. All did say they liked some of our ideas but.....

So with the help of some willing professionals Bill Dunster (Architect), Alex Hole (Business Strategy & Planning) and Mat Bulba (Project Manager, Director of The Low Carbon Trust & Blooming Futures - Green Fuels) turned the communities ideas into some innovative proposals that can be properly funded. Since then we have presented to Coast to Capital (Enterprise Board), SDNP and circulated the proposals to Horsham & Adur District Councils and WSCC who have all supported and liked the ideas. We have presented again to the SDNP Executive & Members and are waiting their views on what they might permit being developed on the site.

The community development will have an Initial Expense of £104M, an Initial Income of £113M and an Annual Income of £5M whilst providing in excess of 500 jobs (detail on PC website)

It is quite clear that the proposals formed from a lot of ideas from the Community and approved in principle by the UB Parish Council are very different to those being proposed by Hargreaves but are by no means set in stone. A lot depends on who and how much we can get to invest.

Once we get some indication from SDNP on their intentions we will hopefully be in a position to hold some public meetings in the Parish to present the proposals more widely and get feedback.

NEWS & GOSSIP AROUND THE VILLAGES**

- **UB Changing Rooms Vandalised:** Vandals broke into the Changing Rooms over the Christmas Holidays and caused damage to the doors and interior. The PC have taken advice from the Police on what action we should take to help prevent this again, Wardens and the Police have increased their surveillance of the site and taken additional actions. The PC with support of the Football Club in particular and the Cricket Club have agreed funding for repairs and some uplift to the internal facilities in the Changing Rooms. The Police have asked the public to report any suspicious people or behaviour to them on 101 if historical or 999 if individuals on site.
- **Eon Rampion Wind Farm:** A recent Parish Council meeting had a presentation from Eon Rampion about the proposed offshore wind farm. This is a huge, £2bn project in the channel 13-20km off our coast. The cables are planned to come onshore at Brooklands near Worthing. They will run up to the Downs and then across North of Lancing College and then down to the Adur valley, over the downs North of Lower Erringham Farm and over Beeding Hill and Tottington Mount before crossing farmland to a new substation at Bolney. The cables will all run underground. Works are planned to start this summer and will progress in sections over the next two years. We are assured that public rights of way will only be closed for 3-4 days at a time and that all down lands will be fully restored. More information will be posted in this newsletter, on our noticeboards and our website.
- **Downslink in Bramber:** Many people have enjoyed the still incomplete improvements to the footpaths and the Downslink in Bramber. The plan is for a path finished with crushed limestone to run from behind St Mary's in Bramber, right down the riverbank and join the Downslink at the footbridge opposite St Botolph's. The Downslink is also being re-routed to pass under the bypass at the Adur Bridge, avoiding the need to cross the busy bypass. Works should be completed this summer. The projects were separately made by the County Council and the Steyning & District Community Partnership. The new facility is so popular that UBPC are looking into making a similar path between Beeding Bridge and Dawn Crescent. If it works then we hope to be able to extend the path further down the Adur and as far as the Botolph's Bridge.
- **No Increase for your Garden Waste collection** Horsham District Council offers a chargeable fortnightly garden waste collection service to householders. The charge for emptying garden waste bins in the Horsham District will remain at just £29 for the third year running - this is the lowest garden waste collection charge in West Sussex. Over 30,000 residents now take advantage of this low cost service. The scheme operates from April to March with a short break over Christmas/New Year.. Wheeled 240 litre bins with a brown lid are used exclusively for garden waste. Residents who sign up to the scheme will receive a membership sticker to attach to the lid of their bin. New and replacement wheeled bins are also available to buy. Existing customers should receive their renewal notifications via email or post for the period 2015/16. You can sign up for the 2015/16 service or pay for a renewal from early February. Signing up online is quick and easy. - **Upper Beeding Football Club:** All their teams are continuing to do extremely well. They were one of only half a dozen Clubs in West Sussex to get their home game played on 21st. Feb. and as everybody had the same amount of heavy rain on Friday, it's got to be down to the excellent work done in recent years by Grasstex and supported by the Parish Council. The Club are very grateful for this and won a top of the table match 1 - 0. It looks like their final home games of the season will be w/e 11/12 April this should be confirmed in the next week and means that repair of the goal areas, verti-draining, levelling, sanding and re-seeding can be undertaken soon after. VILLAGE HALL NEWS

The Village Hall holds a **Quiz on the third Wednesday of each month**, starting at 7.30pm. SO WHAT IS HAPPENING TO THE BRIDGE INN

The Bridge Inn is one of the most prominent and attractive Grade II listed buildings in Upper Beeding. Built circa 1833 it became a public house on the ground floor around 1881 with residential parts above, it served the community well for many years until it closed in 2009. Despite its popularity for most of that time, in the years leading up to its closure it had sadly fallen into a state of disrepair and dilapidation. Major changes had been made to the building over the years, and conservation guidelines had not been followed. After a long period of planning application

consideration and amendment, permission was granted in 2013 to completely renovate the building and sympathetically restore it to its former beauty. It will be converted to a Licensed Cafe on the West side of the ground floor, accessible via a new entranceway on the existing footpath. The cafe seating area will include outside space in the garden at the rear, with a decked area providing stunning uninterrupted views of the river and South Downs. Boat moorings will be reinstated on the river bank to provide a stop-off point for those sailing on the river, and the river footpath and fences will be repaired and improved. The cafe will offer Italian-style coffees and light refreshments, with a high quality range of wines and beers. The remainder of the building will be restored as a private residential house with an extension at the back, consisting of a kitchen and a veranda above as the outside space for the residential parts. The rear of this and neighbouring properties will then be private, with visitors accessing the cafe and garden via the public footpath.

Planned to open in Autumn 2015, the vision for The Bridge Cafe is to provide a stylish social meeting place which offers refreshments to residents of Upper Beeding and the many cyclists, dog walkers, tourists and those sailing on the river. Most importantly, this beautiful historical building will become relevant to the village once again.
